Although Xcel admitted in their report that some aspects of the survey were insufficient, they recommended raising the minimum flow over the spillway from 100 cfs to 300 cfs and conducting the survey again in 2026. MPRB, FMR and many others believe that the minimum flow should be 2,000 cfs, so we have a ways to go! FERC recognizes the minimum flow needs to be higher than 300 cfs and they welcome public input.
